

EARLY GOLD TYPE CHECKLIST

There are a total of eleven major types of early United States gold in three denominations. The three denominations of Early Gold are the \$10 Eagle, \$5 Half Eagle, and \$2.50 Quarter Eagle.

Eagle Types

The first Gold Eagles were struck between mid to late September of 1795, and issued on September 22nd, 1795 with the delivery of 1,097 Gold Eagles.

There were only two types of Eagles.

- Capped Bust Right Small Eagle (1795-1797)
- Capped Bust Right Heraldic eagle (1797-1804)



Half Eagle Types

The first gold coins struck at the U.S. Mint were Half Eagles delivered on July 31st, 1795, which consisted of only 744 Small Eagle gold coins.

There were a total of five types of Half Eagles.

- Capped Bust Right Small Eagle (1795-1798)
- Capped Bust Right Heraldic Eagle (1795-1807)
- Capped Bust Left (1807-1812)
- Capped Head Left Large Size (1813-1829)
- Capped Head Left Reduced Size (1829-1834)



Quarter Eagle Types

The first U.S. Quarter Eagles were struck and delivered on September 21st, 1796.

There were a total of four types of Quarter Eagles.

- Capped Bust Right (1796-1807)
- Capped Bust Left Large Size (1808)
- Capped Head Left Large Size (1821-1827)
- Capped Head Left Reduced Size (1829-1834)
